NOTES ON DEGREE REQUIREMENTS FOR MINORS

1. The Honours Minor may be combined with any approved Honours BA program that offers a major/minor option in the Faculties of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies, Environmental Studies, Fine Arts, Faculty of Health or Faculty of Science and Engineering. For further details on requirements, refer to the listings for specific Honours programs that may be pursued jointly with other Faculties. Note: in a major/minor program, a course may count only once toward major credit or minor credit.
2. The Honours Minor BA Program in East Asian Studies comprises of at least 30 credits in East Asian Studies (other than language/translation courses) including at least one core course and 6 credits at the 4000-level. 18 of the 30 credits must be above the 2000-level. A minor in East Asian Studies is not required to demonstrate competence in an East Asian language.
3. Students wishing to major in East Asian Studies must contact the Program Coordinator/Academic Advisor, 039 McLaughlin College, 416-736-2100, ext. 77042 in order to arrange an academic advising appointment. Continuing Minors are encouraged to meet with the academic advisor.
4. Students may count a maximum of one 1000 level EASP course for credit towards the major in East Asian Studies. *Note : For purposes of meeting program requirements, all General Education courses will count as 6 credits towards the major.*
5. Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies students may complete a **maximum** of four 9 credit General Education courses for degree credit. Students who need to complete more than four General Education courses in order to fulfill program (major or minor) course requirements may do so with permission of the relevant program coordinator or undergraduate director.
6. **Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies regulations require that in order to obtain an Honours BA (120 credits), students must take a total of at least 18 credits at the 4000-level including at least 12 credits at the 4000-level in each Honours Major or Specialized Honours Major.**
